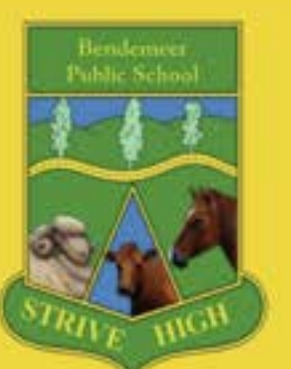

Today we got to see lots of dangerous animals. We saw lizards, snakes and turtles. We put a snake around our neck and it was fun and the snake was big. by Louis

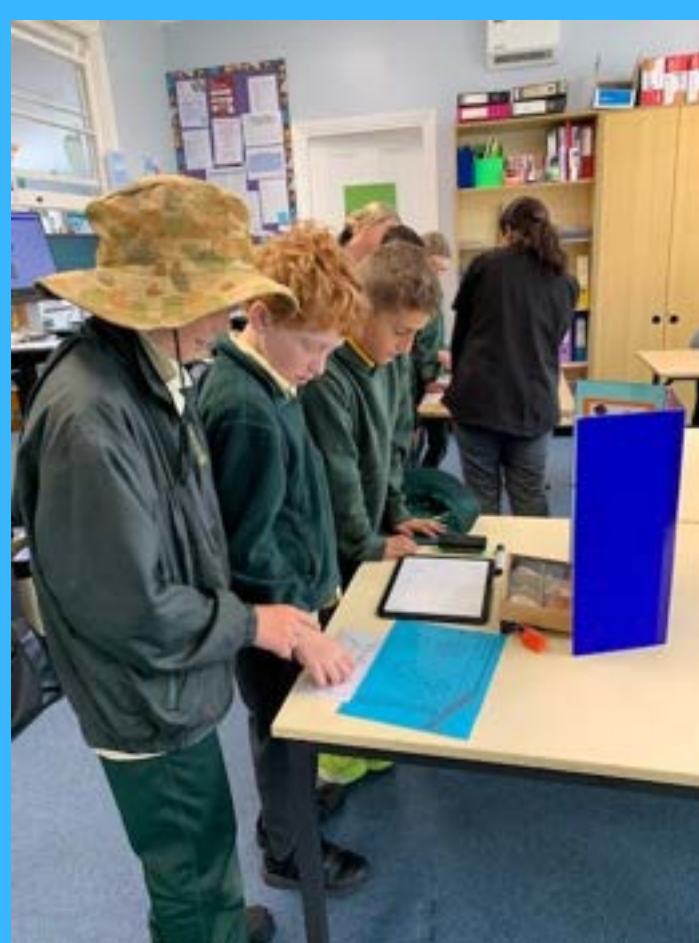
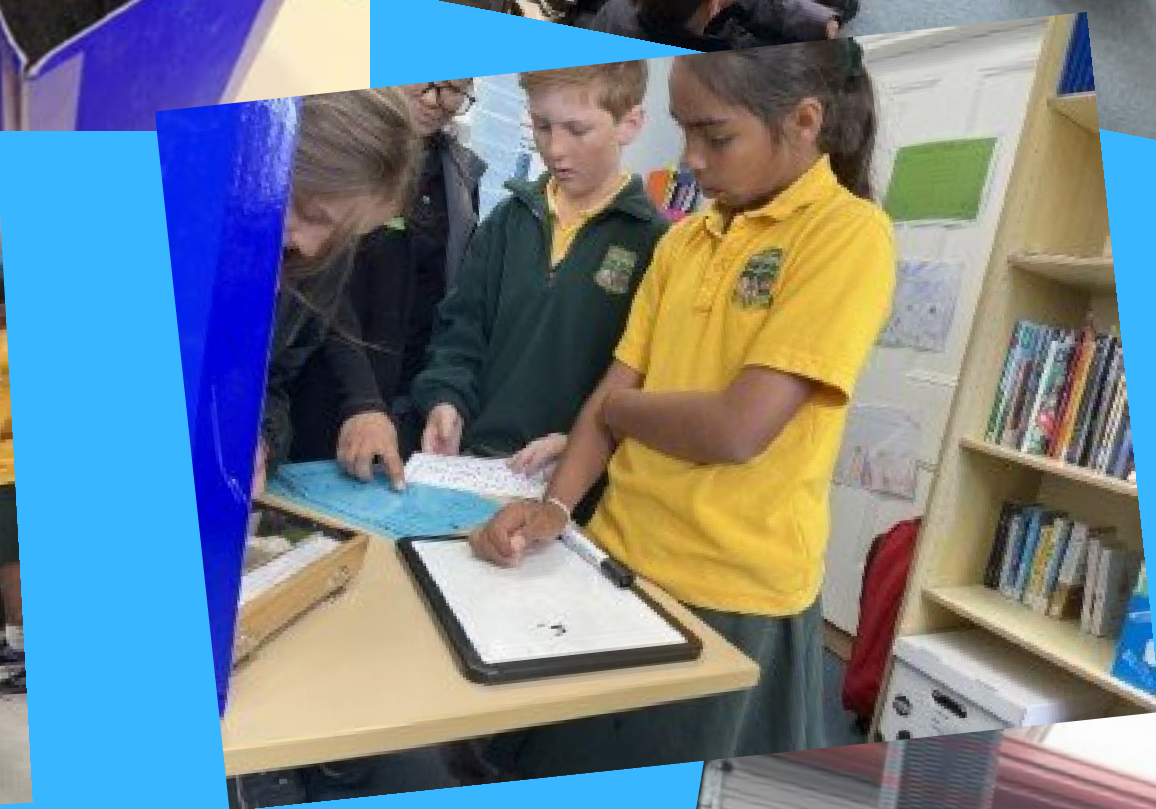
I liked the reptile show because they had snakes and a lizard and we got to take a photo with a snake. By Hudson
