

· Bell's turtles can live up to 100 years!



 They are endangered because foxes keep eating the turtle eggs, droughts, their nests getting flooded and rubbish in the river







- Scientists put a special protective mesh over the turtle nest to protect the eggs
- They only live in the Macdonald river and other rivers in the New England



They are the size of an Oreo biscuit



- They eat weeds and little bugs
- · We released 132 baby Belles Turtles into our river





· The female turtles are bigger than the male turtles

















Doctor Louise Streeting from the University of New England Zoology Department visited Bendemeer recently and we were invited to participate in the release of endangered Bell's Turtle hatchlings into the Macdonald River.

These turtles are endangered due to the fact that foxes and feral pigs dig up the eggs to eat before they hatch.

The students were excited to hold and release these tiny turtles into our river.
